May is a good time to learn about the medicinal properties of fresh herbs. One of my favorites is dandelions because my grandmother in upstate New York would always make a salad with dandelion leaves for Easter Dinner. There are few plants as versatile and useful as the dandelion. (I can hear the groans all the way over here). The leaves can be harvested for a highly nutritious salad or for cooking greens. The roots can be roasted for a yummy coffee alternative, and the flowers make both a lovely tea and a healing oil for skin. In the garden they break up compacted soil by mining for minerals deep into the ground. The minerals are brought up to the leaves, which then decompose and add those minerals to the top layer of soil.

Another useful herb is rosemary and it's not just for cooking. Rosemary is an effective natural deodorizer and one of the top herbs used for hair care. It is often used in everyday soaps and bath gels because the scent is fresh, woodsy and invigorating! When you are in a slump, just rubbing a sprig of rosemary between your hands and breathing in the aroma can bring you right back to yourself! Again, it is one of the many herbs that appreciate a Mediterranean climate – mostly dry and very well-drained. Rosemary shrubs do their very best when pruned regularly.


